
### Third Quarter Financial Update

At the end of 2016, the church adopted a General Operating Fund budget for 2017 that anticipated (based on historical giving) contributions for the guarter of \$109,000. In the first three months of 2017, the church received \$94,500 in contributions for the General Operating Fund. Fortunately, general fund expenses were also reduced in the first quarter, resulting in a net loss for the quarter of \$13,500.

A large proportion of the general fund contributions must be used to pay operating expenses, which include salaries, building upkeep, debt service, and support paid to the United Methodist Church. The finance committee, trustees, and SPRC are working together to reduce these church operating expenses in order to provide funding for the missions of the church which include the Reach, Serve, Worship, Invite, and Grow-learn teams. However, even with cost reductions identified and implemented thus, the church will continue to experience a loss each month unless general fund contributions increase by approximately \$3500 per month. Please prayerfully consider this financial need of FUMC – Pine Mountain.
