SUNDAY SCHOOL: KOINONIA CLASS HAS NEW STUDY

On Sunday, July 16, 2017, the Koinonia class, which meets on the second floor of the Christian Education Building, will begin a study of Martin B. Copenhaver's Jesus Is the Question: The 307 Questions Jesus Asked and the 3 He Answered. We ask that each participant buy a copy of this title, which has a trade-paper price of \$15.99. However, you can buy it online at Christianbook.com for \$11,99 + \$3,99 postage and tax, or you can find it used at other online outlets for less. Please ask Michael Bishop about these outlets and consider joining us.

A program to reduce the church's annual power cost (\$25,000 +/-) was recently completed by the Trustees. This effort involved programing all of our HVAC thermostats to operate within comfortable limits for all scheduled weekly events. This will reduce the probability of radical temperature settings which can last for days and greatly increase our cost of operation. The buildings included in this program are the Annex, the FLC, the CEC and the Sanctuary. These thermostat settings will maintain comfortable temperatures for all of our regular weekly events in those campus buildings. During typical non-use hours the temperature will revert to power saving settings. However, should a temperature need adjusted, thermostat settings can be temporarily changed by simply using the up or down arrows on the device. Please remember to cancel the adjusted temperature by pressing cancel on the thermostat to change the temperature back to the normal schedule.


